I am very grateful to The Reverend Canon Tim Peskett of St John The Divine Church, West Worthing who agreed to be our guest chaplain for the Spring Newsletter.

You will see that Father Tim has given us his Lenten message.



Immediately after His baptism in the River Jordan, Jesus faced and resisted three powerful temptations during 40 days in the wilderness of Judea. This time of testing and temptation was His preparation for the work God had sent Him to do on Earth. It's the principle behind the season of Lent, which begins on 22 February. Although the temptations were personal to Jesus, many of us will recognise their relevance in our own lives.

The first was simple. 'You're hungry. You can do miracles. Well, turn these stones at Your feet into loaves of bread'. It sounds quite plausible, 'but in fact it's an invitation to put one's own needs first. Temptation rejected.

Then came the second: 'throw yourself off a pinnacle of the Temple. You know that God will send His angels to catch you before you hit the ground'. Again, it's plausible (there was even a verse from the Bible to back it up).

But this would be to substitute one spectacular publicity stunt for the hard slog of travel, preaching, healing and touching individual lives. Temptation rejected.

The third was outrageous. 'Fall down and worship corrupt and evil power, and You will have infinite worldly power and success'. In other words, the divine Son of God should deny His Father and worship the devil, to glean success without going to the Cross. For the third time, temptation resisted.

l know these temptations were tests of the Lord Jesus Christ, but can't we see in them temptations that come to all of us from time to time? Look after number one, and all will be well. Take the short cut to success and avoid all the hard slog. Compromise your integrity, in order to fulfill your ambitions. Or choose the hard way: walk the narrow path of honesty, commitment, and truth. That's really the Lenten choice.

Adoption of the 2020 reunion AGM minutes and matters arising

Presentation and Adoption of the 2020 accounts-Alan Caperon

Alan Caperon presented the Associations accounts for 2020 which had been verified by Christine Townsend, Chartered Accountant. The members unanimously approved the adoption of the accounts.

Presentation and Adoption of the 2021 accounts-Alan Caperon

The accounts for 2021 were presented (to be independently examined by Chartered Accountant Garry Lock) and to be published in the Summer newsletter.

The Battalion President-Gary Pickett

Gary Pickett gave a positive report about the battalion. Despite lockdown and restrictions, the BB has continued for the boys, with the help of the BB at Home program and some companies meeting on zoom. Glynde camp was able to take place in 2021, although in a different format, split into two four-day camps it was the largest camp for several years. Gary thanked the association for their part in the funding for ten new bell tents. He was sad to announce the closure of the 10th, 14th, 25th Brighton and 1st Roffey companies, but said the seven remaining companies are all showing growth and stability. During this time 6 Queens badges had been awarded and the Ernest Beal VC award was presented to Harry Newman in 2020 and to Tom Baty in 2021. Gary thanked the members for their support and prayers.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL MEN MEMBERS OVER THE AGE OF 65

This morning I went for an ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURYSM (AAA) screening I went because a friend insisted I did - after he had gone following the death of a friend of his who didn't go! A timely test in that case would undoubtedly have saved his friend's life!

The test is (supposedly!) offered to all MEN over 65 and SHOULD be offered automatically. **I was never offered one** - and I'm willing to bet that most of our male members over 65 haven't been offered one either. I got my appointment by going on-line and requesting one. Entering my NHS number, the system knew that I hadn't had one and instantly offered me a choice of venues and appointment times: I got an appointment within two weeks: probably much quicker than my GP would have got me one! It was as simple as that.

The scan itself took about 3 minutes and I was back home within an hour of setting off to the Hove Polyclinic. All the test entailed was baring my chest. I was given the result there and then. Fortunately I was OK.

All the 65+ men should take the test - it can be a life-saver.

This is obviously an important test and should not be ignored. I certainly wasn't aware that it should have been offered to me when I got to 65, or that my GP should have arranged it. He didn't! I was particularly annoyed because, about 30 years ago, a friend of ours dropped dead aged about 50 when just such an aneurysm burst: when they burst there is no other outcome. No time to call an ambulance - you are DEAD!!

PLEASE, DO NOT IGNORE THIS, GO STRAIGHT ON-LINE AND BOOK YOUR TEST NOW.

What happens during AAA screening

Screening for AAA involves a quick and painless ultrasound scan of your stomach. When you arrive for your appointment, a screening technician will check your details, explain the scan and ask if you have any questions.

For the scan:

you lie down on a table and lift up or unbutton your top (you do not need to undress) the technician rubs a clear gel on your tummy and moves a small handheld scanner over your skin – pictures from the scanner are shown on a monitor and the technician will measure how wide your aorta is the gel is wiped away and you pull down or button up your top the technician tells you the result straight away. The whole test usually takes about 10 to 15 minutes.

Sometimes the technician might not be able to see your aorta clearly. This is not anything to worry about. If this happens, you'll be asked to have another scan, usually on a different day.

Results of AAA screening - You'll be told your result at the end of the test. If a problem is found, you'll also be a sent letter confirming the result and letting you know what happens next. There are 4 possible screening results;

No aneurysm found

If your aorta is less than 3cm wide, this means it's not enlarged. Most men have this result.

You will not need to have any treatment or monitoring afterwards, and will not be invited for AAA screening again.

Small AAA

If you have a small AAA, this means your aorta measures 3cm to 4.4cm across. Just over 1% of men screened have a small AAA. You will not need any treatment at this stage as the chance of the AAA bursting is small. You'll be invited back for a scan every year to check its size. Treatment will usually only be needed if it becomes a large AAA. You'll also be given advice on how you can stop an AAA getting bigger, such as stopping smoking, eating healthily and exercising regularly.

Medium AAA

If you have a medium AAA, this means your aorta measures 4.5cm to 5.4cm across. About 0.5% of men screened have a medium AAA. You will not need any treatment at this stage as the chance of the AAA bursting is small. You'll be invited back for a scan every 3 months to check its size. Treatment will usually only be needed if it becomes a large AAA. You'll also be given advice on how you can stop an AAA getting bigger, such as stopping smoking, eating healthily and exercising regularly.

Large AAA

If you have a large AAA, this means your aorta measures 5.5cm or more across. About 0.1% of men screened have a large AAA. As large AAAs have the highest risk of bursting if left untreated, you'll be referred to a specialist surgeon within 2 weeks to talk about your treatment options. Most men with a large AAA are advised to have surgery to stop it getting bigger or bursting. While surgery carries a risk of serious complications, this is generally smaller than the risk of not treating a large AAA.
