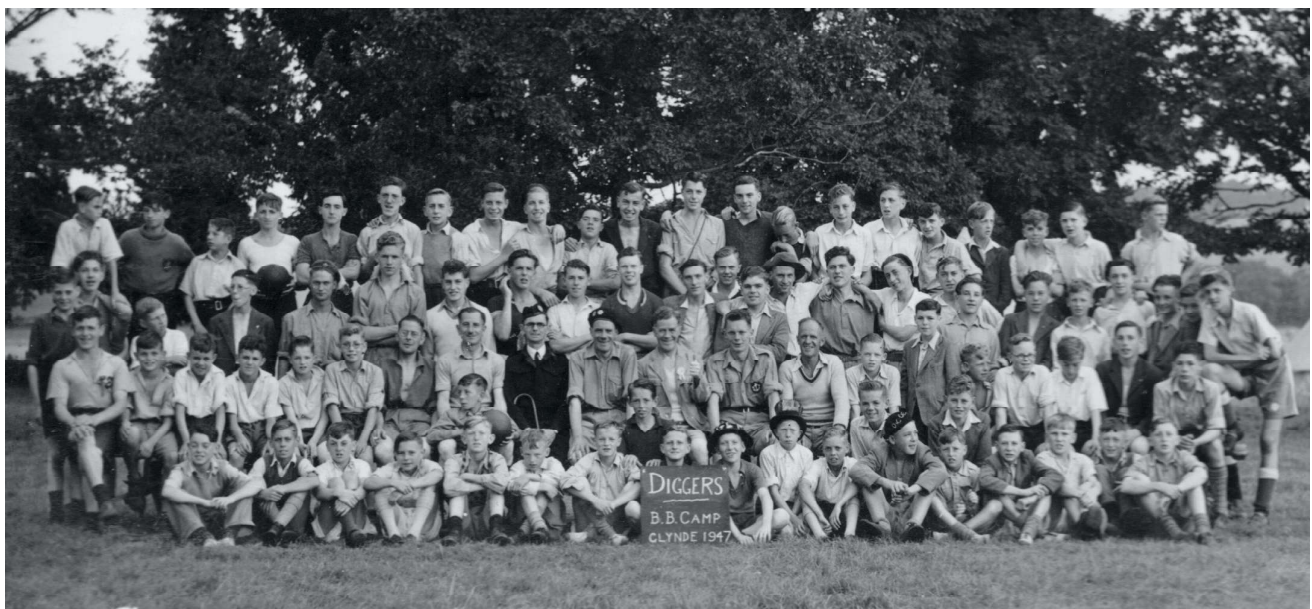

A Typical BB Christmas

I have been invited to share some of my memories of past BB Christmas activities which involved the lads of the 4th Eastbourne Company.

I remember that Christmas started the middle of November with the Anchor Boys. Each week the boys would complete some art or craft work which was saved by the staff and at the final session before the Christmas break each child went home with a large box of goodies including presents for parents together with a gift from the officers. For the Junior Section similar activities were arranged with simple toys and decorations not only for the lads to take home but some to sell at the church bazaar. Does your church still hold Bazaars?

The bazaar was one of the money raising activities of the church and the Company Section provided some of the manual labour setting up stalls and providing lads to serve where needed. The lads also collected items to sell on the various stalls and then when the bazaar was finished helped to clear the rooms for church the next day. The men of the church were always very grateful.

One of the best remembered Christmas activities was the pantomime, featuring all the staff in costume and almost word perfect. The story, if I remember right, was a cross between Dick Whittington and Sleeping Beauty with the final song being 'You'll never walk alone' I don't think it won any 'Oscars' but was much appreciated by parents and boys.

The question that I reflect on now is, what influence did we officers have on our lads over the Christmas period and do they remember the story of the greatest happening the world has ever known? Were our boy's lives affected in any way by what was said in devotions. Do they still sing carols under their breath? I would love to know.

A Sporting Life

My family have always been sports men and women. Mum was a strong swimmer and won the Brighton Pier to Pier Race. Dad played football and my brother Barry followed in his footsteps, playing professionally for Brighton and Salisbury City. Barry was 5 years older than me but 5 years younger than Peter, who played Rugby for Hove Rugby Club and The Army.

I followed in Mum's footsteps by taking up swimming. I also competed in the Sussex Schools Sports in the discus and javelin. I won the discus event and went on to the Southern area finals at Crystal Palace. I was not a natural athlete so I concentrated on my swimming. In 1968 my times were such that I was looking to qualify for the Mexico Olympics.

I enjoyed football but did not have my older brothers' talent. I played in the local leagues but found my niche' in Refereeing and coaching.

A number of us from the 13th Brighton and from Bevendean started a team called Paragon in the mid sixties and played in the Sunday league soon after receiving our discharge certificates from the 13th.

First in the back row was Roger(Paddy) Flynn who's Dad was an Ice Hockey referee. I'm standing between him and the goalkeeper. To the right of the goalie is John Bishop, who was a prolific goal scorer and had trials with Chelsea. Second from the right in the back row is Bill Dean, one of trio of lads from Hornby Road in Bevendean. In the front row with the ball is Alan(Robbie) Ollis with Peter Ilott on the right. So the 13th made up almost half of the team.

In the Boys Brigade I was introduced to a number of sports and attained my Arts & Crafts badge by doing fencing and judo. I was also introduced to Stoolball at camp and played for Outlaws, a local team with Brian and Barry Griffin.

In 1968 I was working at Creed's at Hollingbury where I made friends with Pat Richardson, an Irishman who played bowls at Carlton Bowls Club on the corner of Preston Road and Preston Drove. In 1984 we moved from Brighton to Ringmer and I found the travel to Brighton too much so I joined Lewes Bowls Club. In 1992 I was runner up in the club championship and the pairs with Jim Edwards. I was playing well and I was approached by a friend to play for Ringmer which made more sense as there was so little travelling. I played there for 17 years until we moved house again and I played for several clubs in the Eastbourne and Hailsham area.

It was while I was playing for Ringmer in 2003 that I got the call to play for Sussex. As a 6th generation Sussex man I was immensely proud to wear the shirt. It was away at Nailsworth Mills in Gloucester. I arrived at Grattons Bowls Club in Crawley at 9.45 to meet the coach, scheduled to depart at 10 o/c. but it had gone. I drove all the way to Gloucester in driving rain expecting the match to be called off. It wasn't. They said that as we had travelled such a long way the game would be played. I don't remember the result, only that the water was running down my neck inside my waterproof jacket. There was standing water on the green so the conditions were very difficult.

That was my first of 32 county matches over the last 21 years but I was forced to miss the whole of 2024 as I needed a hip replacement. The operation was 100% successful and I have had a full season of bowling this year although it was a slow start and I was only selected for one county match late in the season. Bowls has been good to me and I have had immense enjoyment playing over a long period. I'm still fit enough to play but I coach as much as I play these days as I love to pass on my many years experience to others.

Ernest James Griffin (Nickname BUMBLE)

Born 6th April 1909, Ware, Hertfordshire.

Moved to Brighton for his fathers health.

Joined the old 3rd Brighton, Countess of Huntington, North Street (Now demolished)



He went to camp as a boy and later as an officer. Excelled at sports and gymnastics and also the ability to create humour. The nickname arose among his friends due to his funny way of running. After the war ended in May 1945 he did not come home until November 1946 as he was sent to Palestine as part of the peacekeeping force – not much changes. He somehow managed to wangle his way to Bethlehem on Christmas Eve 1945 to see the celebrations of Christ's birth. Whilst in Palestine he was so glad to see some of the places he read about in his bible at BB bible classes etc.

When back in late 1946 he got back in touch with his BB friends and helped Jack Rovey who was Capt of the 11th Brighton in Lewes Road opposite the 13th. He was back at camp the next year. One thing he was known for was to lead the camp band round the camp at 7am to make sure everyone was awake and used a huge wooden mallet as a mace. He later acted as a Medical Officer and also entertainments officer where he used to recite limericks at lunchtime (little 5 line ditties) if a boy made one up they would get 6d which was quite a lot in old money. He also used to put together a camp concert on the Thursday night and arrange other things in the event of wet weather. In the early 1950's he formed the new 3rd Brighton based at Christ the King in Patcham with Les Harris and Wilf Constable. Due to lack of facilities and helpers the company folded and some boys moved to the 30th in Patcham and others to the 16th at Stamford Avenue. He continued to keep going to camp his last in 1963 and he died from a heart condition in January 1964.

His friends, Harry Norman Vic Knowles, Jack Shorten to name a few decided to have a memorial and had a lecturn made to keep the camp bible and prayer book in and a blue table cloth with the BB Crest. A memorial service was held at Glynde Camp in August 1964 where his family and friends came. They also planted an oak tree in the cricket ground which unfortunately died a few years later followed by another that suffered the same fate. Later we planted a field maple which thrived and stands tall in the old cricket field today.

Truly a man of his time who is sadly missed.

We then made our way to Ernest Beal's VC paving stone where we placed the Stedfast Wreath. A kind lady passer-by offered to take photo of us both.

Stedfast donated a second wreath which was laid at Southwick War Memorial during the Civic Parade on Sunday 9th by local BB boys on our behalf.

Peter Ford our President, shared a few words about that first meeting and the man we need to thank for founding the Boys' Brigade, Sir William Alexander Smith. We shared a toast to our founder, before resuming our meals. The evening concluded with the singing of the vesper.
